Energy Clinic students develop the knowledge, skills, and values integral to the practice of energy law and policy, while helping clients meet local energy needs with reliable, clean, and affordable resources. 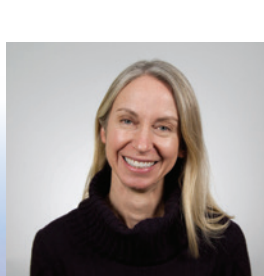
